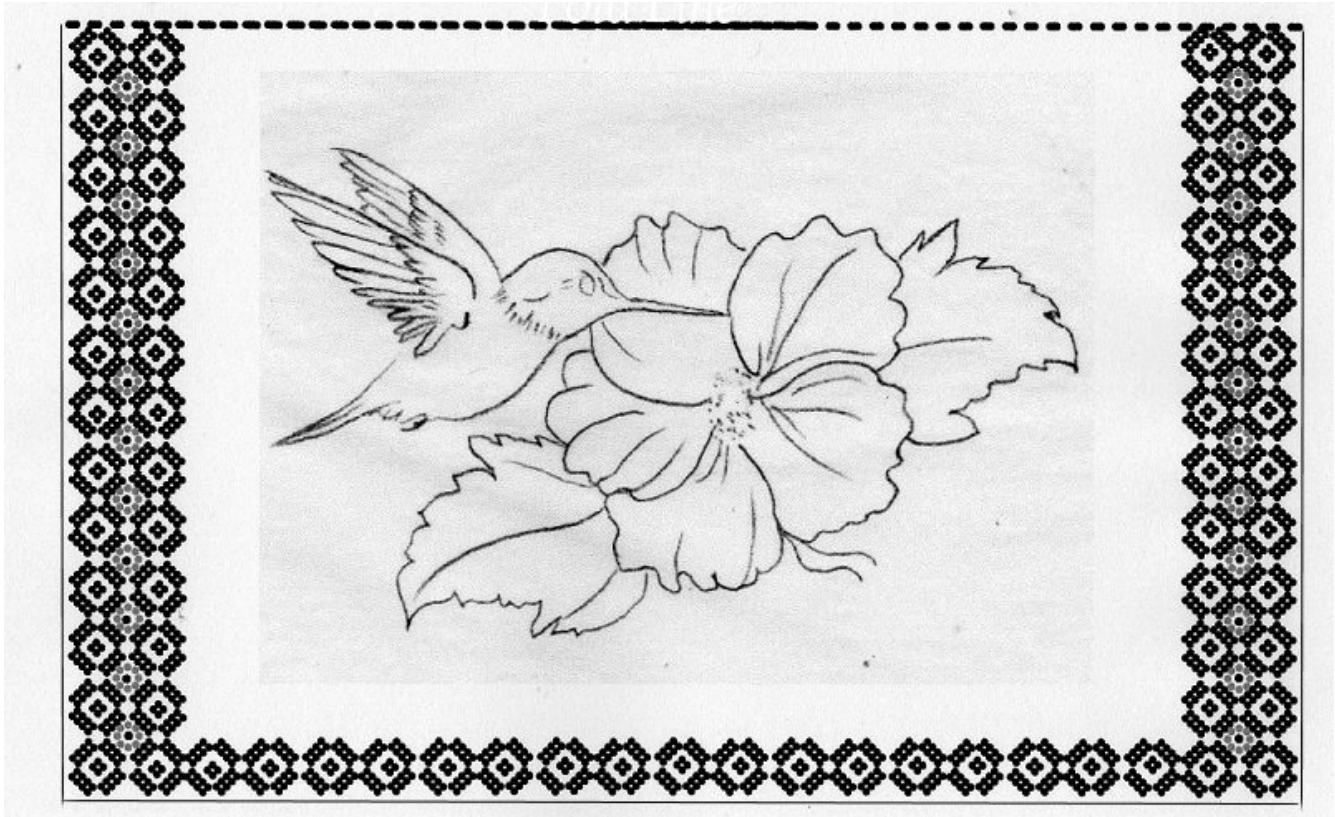


# Summer Hummer



You will need:

Parchment paper

2-needle tool

4-needle tool

slot tool

Large sun tool

Large, medium, small, and micro ball tools

Scriber or 1-needle tool

Polychromos in the following colors or the colors of your choice:

278 Chrome Oxide Green    125 Middle Purple Pink    177 Walnut Brown    171 Light Green

167 Permanent Green Olive    119 Light Magenta    199 Black    142 Madder

168 Earth Green.    101 White    251 Silver    217 Middle Cadmium Red

102 Cream                    185 Naples Yellow                    276 Chrome Oxide Green Fiery  
133 Magenta                182 Brown Ocher                    165 Emerald Green    274 Warm Grey V  
270 Warm Grey I                    272 Warm Grey III  
Blue oil pastel crayon and spreading medium  
Card stock and insert paper of your choice  
PCA Fine diagonal grid  
PCA Fine straight grid (optional)

*Directions:*

Work the border pattern on the PCA Diagonal grid

Place your parchment paper over the pattern using your pencils (or medium of your choice) to color in the flower – 133, 125, 119, 101; for the flower center – 185 add dots of 182, 177, 199.

For the leaves – 278, 167, 168, 102

Use some strokes of silver (251) on the humming bird. The back and wings – 276, 165, 171; throat – 142, 217; belly – 270, 272, 274

On the back, spread blue oil pastel around the image.

Emboss the flower, and leaves with your largest ball tools. Use the scribe or 1-needle tool for feathering at the ends of the wing and tail feathers, and a few strokes at the throat.

Use the small ball tool and ruler around the entire pattern, and the small ball tool for dots within the border pattern. Use the large sun tool in the border pattern, and emboss a dot in the center with the micro ball tool. (Alternatively, place the parchment paper on the PCA Fine straight grid and perforate around the card with the 4-needle tool.)

Re-perforate border pattern deeply. Cut out the slots and crosses.

Cut out around the card (can perforate using the PCA straight grid to keep your edges even)

Attach to card stock by sewing at the spine. As an alternative, use double-sided tape.
